Angus' most spectacular accomplishment - the first human-powered circumnavigation of the planet - is chronicled in his book, Beyond the Horizon: The Great Race to Finish the First Human-Powered Circumnavigation of the Planet. The book details how he walked, biked, skied, paddled, and rowed more then 43,000 kilometers, crossing three continents and two oceans to complete the first human-powered circumnavigation of the Earth. Angus endured the extreme arctic temperatures of Siberia, cycled, and hiked through Russia and across Europe. He survived not one - but two - hurricanes, as well as two tropical storms while floating in a wooden rowboat in the mid-Atlantic Ocean.

Olympic Village, BC Place and Science World



Vancouver's Olympic and Paralympic Village is located on the southeast side of False Creek and offers stunning views of the city's downtown skyline and Coast mountains. BC Place Stadium is a multi-purpose stadium and Canada's first domed arena. BC Place Stadium is the largest air-supported stadium in the world. It is located on the north side of False Creek in Vancouver. Science World's exhibits are designed to engage and entertain a broad spectrum of people, from toddlers to senior citizens. Younger children may find a gallery like Kidspace most interesting, whereas adults might have more fun in a gallery like BodyWorks.

Stanley Park

Stanley Park is recognized around the globe as one of the great parks of the world! Vancouver's first park and one of the city's main tourist attractions, Stanley Park is an evergreen oasis of 400 hectares (1,000 acres) close to the downtown core. Its natural west coast atmosphere, offering a back drop of majestic cedar, hemlock and fir trees embraces visitors and transports them to an environment rich in tranquility. The park abounds in wildlife and its features appeal to the naturalist, the plant lover or one who would do nothing more than relax in beautiful surroundings.

Seawall

The seawall refers to the 22km (13.7 miles) walking, jogging, cycling and inline skating path that lines Vancouver's waterfront from the convention centre on Burrard Inlet (Coal Harbour), around Stanley Park and False Creek, past Granville Island and ending at Kitsilano Beach Park. It is the most popular recreational facility in Vancouver and is on the "to do" lists of many visitors.

Robson Street: Vancouver's most trendy shopping district

Vancouver's most trendy shopping district is just a ten minute walk from Canada Place. Within its core commercial blocks, that stretch from Burrard to Jervis Street, you'll find dozens of fashion stores, restaurants, souvenir shops and currency exchanges. A number of large international brands have a presence on Robson Street including Armani, Banana Republic, Body Shop, Club Monaco, Ferragamo, Gap, Guess, Levi's, Nike, and Zara.

Some have special areas that have been cordoned-off for swimming, ensuring maximum lifeguard coverage. Enjoy our designated "quiet beaches" (Locarno, Spanish Bank West and Sunset Beach), where amplified music is prohibited. English Bay beach is a short distance from Stanley Park. It's a wonderful place to unwind and watch the sunset after a busy day.
